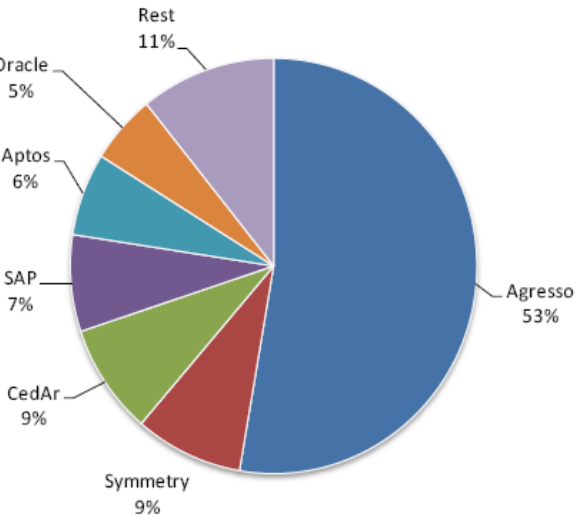

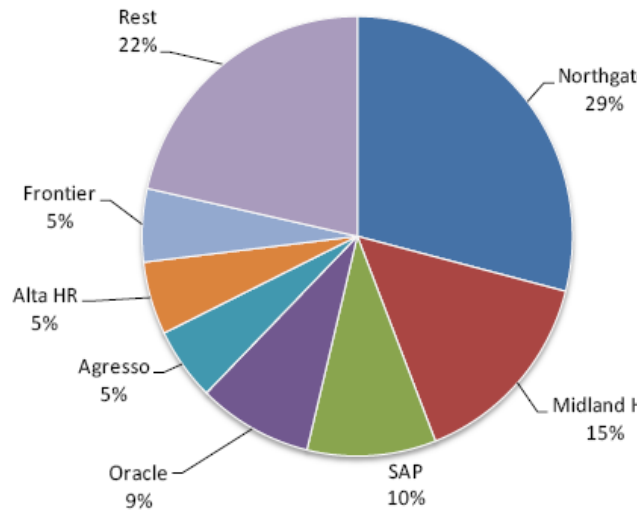

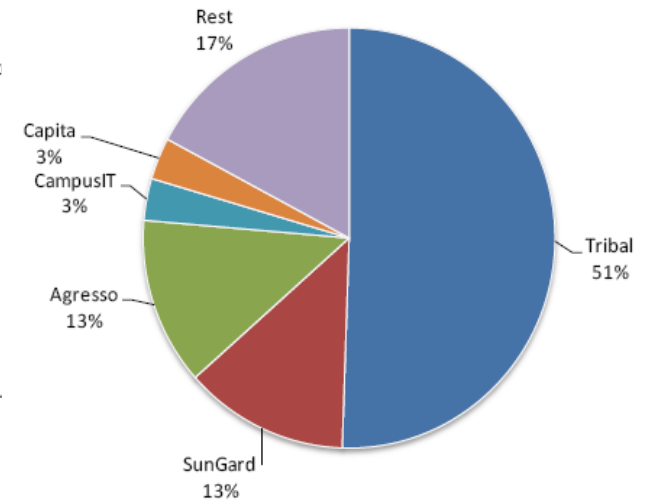
Principal Finance systems in use in HE



Principal HR systems in use in HE

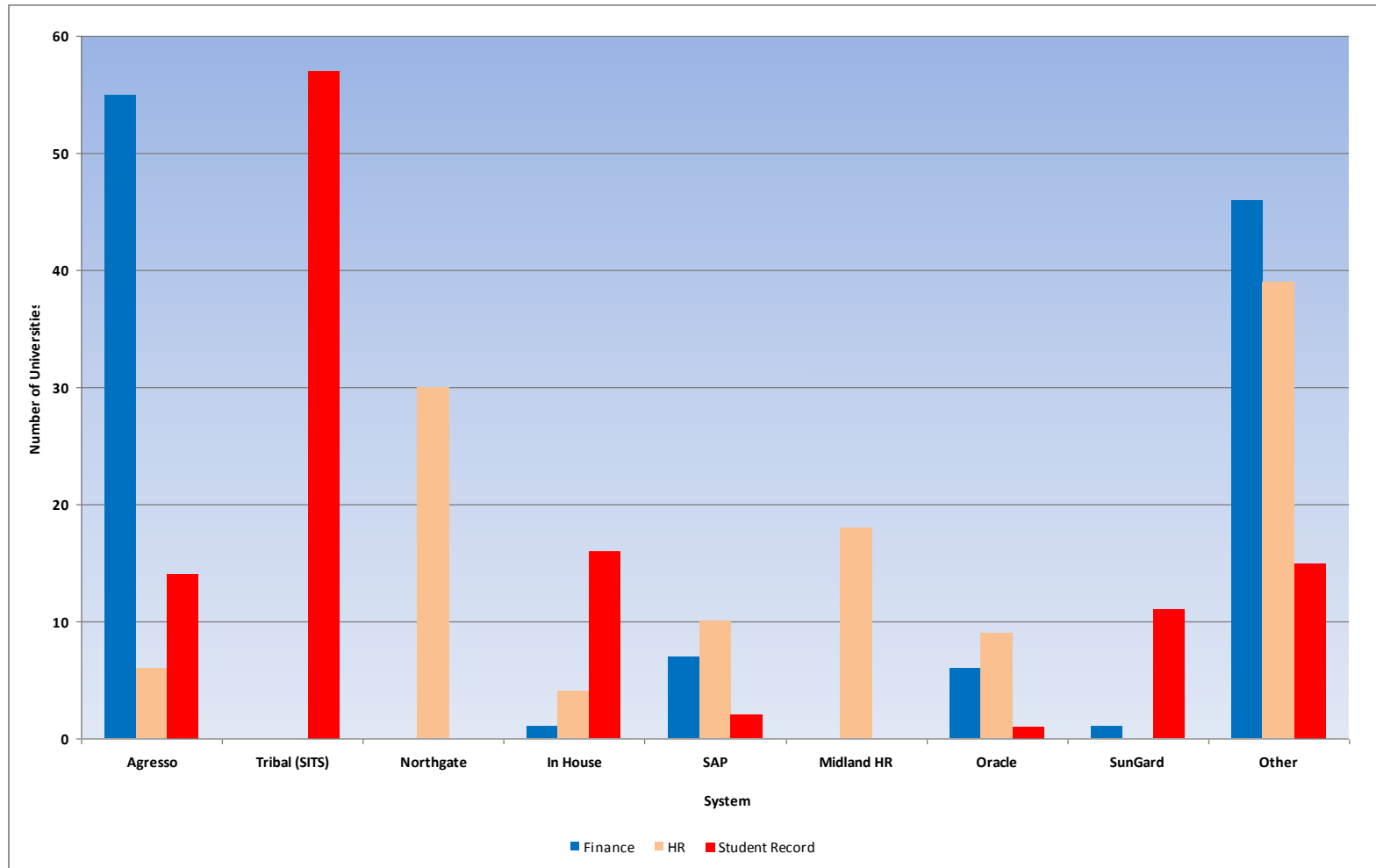


Principal Student records systems in use in HE
